All Cups and trophies will be presented on the day and those won at the 2020 Show MUST BE RETURNED CLEANED AND ENGRAVED to Gregory Equine, 45 Firth Street, Matamata by 23rd September, prior to the show unless prior arrangements made with Secretary.

Rules and Conditions

- No entries will be acknowledged unless accompanied
- Run under the Bylaws and Regulations of the RAS and/or the Local Conditions as designated. Rule Book available on www.ras.org.nz.
- Each exhibitor must supervise and control their animals at all times and shall be liable for any hazards created, or accidents, illness or damage caused by the action of themselves or their animals at the show grounds. Exhibitors must comply with the appropriate animal legislation and the Health and Safety at Work Act 2015 and any amendments.
- The Matamata A&P Association has arranged a Public Liability Insurance Policy in the Horse and Cattle Sections of the show. This policy covers each exhibitor and competitor for any property damage claims that may result from their negligence while on the show grounds.
- i.Yellow Card This show/event supports the RAS 'Yellow Card' system. A Yellow Card will be issued, in cases of offenses in respect of abuse of animals or inappropriate behaviour as per the RAS Constitution and the RAS Rules & Regulations/Bylaws including the Equestrian Rulebook, the RAS affiliated Show/Event/registered Measuring Stand and their grounds and their duly appointed delegates may deliver to the Person Responsible a Yellow Warning Card (either immediately or within 10 days of the show) which suspends any penalty until possible new offenses. Full wording of the 'Yellow Card' system is available to view on the RAS website – www.ras.org.nz.
 - ii. Clean Sport The Rules of the Royal A&P Society NZ in regard to Clean Sport apply. Competitors are advised that tests for forbidden substances may be carried out during the Show/Event and that testing of all animals is at the person responsible's risk. Forbidden Substance - Any substance capable of affecting the speed, stamina, courage or conduct of a horse, pony, donkey or mule by its action upon the central or peripheral nervous system or the cardio-vascular, respiratory, alimentary, digestive, musculoskeletal urogenital systems.
 - iii. Arrears No person who is in arrears with regards to entry fees, subscriptions, or any other show/event charge is eligible to compete at any affiliated show/event. Proof of payment will be required before any restriction is lifted.
 - iv.Summary of RAS Resolution Process the full process can be found on the RAS website www.ras.org.nz. The principle behind the process is to deal with the matter as it comes to hand and in most cases, it should be dealt with directly by the show. If the matter is in regard to an RAS official, any concern to be forwarded on to the RAS CEO to deal with this in an appropriate manner.
- The Matamata A&P Association Show Committee reserves the right to refuse or cancel any entry without adducting any reason for doing so.
- Except in rider classes, every animal must be named.
- A Novice exhibit or rider is one that has yet to win six classes in any division within the competitions provided at ant A&P Show. Novice animals are eligible for open classes.
- In all ridden events an approved safety helmet must be worn. Note: All riders must wear approved and 'red' tagged head gear, which must conform with one of the current approved safety standards. Such headgear must be worn with the chin strap properly adjusted and fastened when in the arena or ring, the practice area, collecting rings or anywhere else within the show grounds. Note: New Standards as from 1 August 2023 - yellow tags to be shown on helmets https://www.ras.org.nz/equestrian/health-and-safety/
- 10 Whiskers and Inner Ear Trimming as from 1 January 2022 https://www.ras.org.nz/equestrian/whisker-and-inner-ear-

- trimming/ There is to be no trimming of whiskers, eye or inner ear hair/whiskers of Horses/ponies competing at RAS affiliated A&P Shows/Events.
- 11 No dressage type whips are allowed in ridden classes. Refer RAS rules.
- 12 The measuring rules of the RAS of NZ will apply at this show. All Horses and Ponies must have a current height certificate which shall be presented on request. Prize money may be withheld if such certificate is not available.
- Starting times are approximate only, but will be adhered to as closely as possible. Although it is provided that horses may compete in more than one class, or any or all such classes may be judged simultaneously at the convenience of the judges or stewards, in all such cases exhibitors having an exhibit in more than one class must elect in which class they compete. The steward will call their name twice only. Entry fees will not be refunded if an event is missed through not hearing the call.
- 14 Scratchings: refund of entry fees will be considered if scratchings are made in writing officially to the Secretary by Tuesday prior to the show. Refunds will be less 50% of the original entry fee. Veterinarian/Doctors certificate is required for scratchings during the show. Refunds are at the discretion of the Show Committee.
- All competitors must park their floats and trucks in the area designated for this purpose. NO EXCEPTIONS.
- 16 No dogs allowed on grounds.
- 17 Performance Cards: It is the responsibility of the owner/rider to present these to the Horse/Pony Ring office for updating. No card – no prize money.
- 18 Rider/Handlers age and eligibility is determined as per the 1st of August i.e. riders/handlers who are of age for any division/section of the 1st of August complete the show year/season in that division/section.
- The committee has the right to substitute prize money for vouchers in some classes.
- Individual Membership \$15.00, family Membership \$25 (2 or more people/exhibitors).
- Class 1: Ridden Thoroughbred Show Horse. Each RAS annually registered Thoroughbred will receive registration number - registration is free, and form is available on RAS website. Judging - 80% Conformation, 20% Paces and Manners. Registration number must be written on entry forms – if no registration number given the points allocated will not count. Judges to assess each horse individually with saddles removed after they have been assessed ridden. Horses to show a good walk as well as gallop (room permitting).
- Refunds will be looked at for unforeseen circumstances and you will be contacted accordingly. Covid-19 restrictions will be in place as per Government instructions at the time of the show. The Matamata A&P Association or any other organisations in conjunction with the show will not be held accountable for any cancellation of all or part of the show.
- 23 Prize money to be processed after show day via Evo Events (Equestrian section only). Please verify Bank Account Numbers on entry.

- 1 The administration of any drug to enhance the appearance of the animal.
- 2 The infusion of any substance to the mammary system to alter the outward appearance of the udder or milk veins.
- 3 The gluing, sealing or taping of teats or use of artificial practices to affect the teat angle or teat placement.
- 4 All entries must be accompanied by a signed declaration by the exhibitor agreeing that their stock be available for testing or scrutiny by a suitably qualified person appointed by the Matamata Agricultural and Pastoral Show to detect any malpractice.

- 5 All animals entered for showing or exhibiting must be from a current TB Clear Status Herd.
- A copy of the current TB test certificate must be attached to entry forms. The Association must be notified at the time of entry of any testing to be carried out after the closing date of entries or of any potential TB issues that may arise after entries have been submitted. Owners entering cattle must sign a declaration printed on the entry form.

There are two documents required:

FIRST

document is a TB Test Certificate. For animals from a Declared Movement Control Area – all animals aged three months or older are to be TB tested and have clear test within 60 days prior to being moved to the show. All other animals must be from a herd that is up to date with its current routine TB testing requirements.

SECOND

document is a TB Animal Status Declaration Card. This is a legal requirement for all animals being moved. All animals entered must be accompanied in transit by a signed and dated TB animal Status Declaration Card showing a TB clear status in accordance with present legislation. Animal individual numbers must be included on the TB test sheet. These cards may be inspected at the unloading area.

For cattle being moved from 1 July 2012: A NAIT approved RFID tag will be mandatory for all movements of cattle, including day old calves. NAIT approved RFID cattle tags are white only. Please do not remove tags if cattle are identified with Animal Health Board or MINDA tags.

As of 1 July 2012 a secondary tag is no longer required under the new NAIT scheme.

All animals being exhibited at the Show including any participating in a hoof and hooks carcase competition come under the standard identification and ASD regulations. These cattle will require the NAIT approved RFID tag.

Where live cattle or deer form part of a trade display the exhibitor is responsible for:

(i) Ensuring all stock have completed all TB testing requirements as per Animal Health Board testing regulations.

A \$5.75 levy is to be charged per in-milk cow, per show i.e if an in-milk cow is entered in more than one class at a show then the levy is still \$5.75. There is no levy on exhibiting young stock.

Biosecurity New Zealand

Mycoplasma Bovis Minimising the risk at shows and events

Mycoplasma Bovis is a bacterial disease that only affects cattle. The main way Mycoplasma Bovis spreads is through close and prolonged contact between cattle; and calves drinking milk from infected cows.

The risk of Mycoplasma Bovis spreading at A&P shows, calf days, rodeo and other events where cattle are present is quite low, but there is still a risk wherever cattle may mingle.

Event organisers need to take these risks into account and manage mitigations when deciding id to hold their event while Mycoplasma Bovis is being eradicated in New Zealand.

Animals on known infected farms are under movement control, and cannot be moved without MPI's permission. However through efforts to eradicate this disease we are still tracing movements of animals, and we expect there are some we havn't reached and tested. So it is important you take extra precautions to reduce your chances of spreading Mycoplasma Bovis.

What can exhibitors do?

- Animals on properties under any suspicion of exposure to Mycoplasma Bovis should not be transported to shows and events.
- Animals showing clinical signs of ANY disease should not be transported to shows, as per normal biosecurity practice.
- Make sure your cattle are tagged and registered with NAIT.
- Keep your NAIT movements up-to-date and accurate and record movements to and from the event. Guidance is available on *nait.co.nz*
- Practice good on-farm biosecurity and clean and disinfect outerwear, boots, and equipment before attending a show or event. On your return, clean and disinfect again before taking outerwear, boots and equipment back onto your farm. For more information refer to the guidance on *mpi.govt.nz/bovis*

What can exhibitors do?

- Ensure that exhibitors and participants are aware of your biosecurity and hygiene recommendations and their NAIT obligations.
- Animals without a NAIT tag should be denied entry and non-compliance reported to MPI
- Ensure stalls are cleaned out before you put cattle in them, and after cattle are removed. Where possible, don't use the same stalls for cattle belonging to different competitors.
- Provide hand sanitizer for anyone likely to be handling the heads of animals from different owners.
- Any milking equipment used at the show should be cleaned and disinfected between uses on animals from different exhibitors.
- Give animal's individual water do not allow animals to drink from shared troughs.
- Best practice is to separate animals of the same species where possible, to prevent the spread of any disease. This can be by separating animals with walkways, using empty pens, and using outriggers or double barriers where animals are in adjacent pens.
- Don't keep animals in show pens for long, to reduce stress and nose-to-nose contact.
- Keep animals from different herds separate and avoid their nose-to-nose contact.
- Ensure pens are secure, and that when animals are out they are tethered or being securely managed by somebody who is strong and skilled enough (this could mean supervising children with calves).
- It's an opportunity to teach people about on-farm bio-security. There's more on www.mpi.govt.nz/bovis.
