#### **RULES & REGULATIONS**

1 All entries accompanied by fees must be in the hands of the Secretary on or before **FRIDAY 24 FEBRUARY 2023.** Intending exhibitors are requested to make their entries as early as possible. No entry fee will be refunded.

2 All entries must be made in the name of the bona fide owner of the exhibit.

3 The Association reserves the right to demand the removal from the grounds of any animal deemed to be infected with any disease, such as foot rot, lice, ticks etc.

4 All exhibits must be on the grounds at the time stated.

5 Sheep from stud flocks shall not be eligible for competition, except in classes stated 'Stud Sheep'.

6 Any ewe which is barren shall not be eligible to take a prize except in fat stock classes. 7 Exhibits arriving on the day preceding Show will be taken care of but the Association will not be responsible for loss, damage or misdelivery of stock or exhibit to be exhibited at Show.

8 Breeders and owners are invited to show stock in any section for "Exhibition Only". 9 No horse shall be permitted in judging ring wearing any prize ribbon or ticket from previous events.

10 No owner shall be permitted to be in charge of exhibit during judging except in classes of horses and dogs.

11 A Novice Horse or Pony is one that has yet to win 6 firsts in conformation classes at any A & P Show, at the time of the Show. The same is for Paced and Mannered classes.

12 Where a competitor is entered in two classes that are being judged at the same time the competitor must nominate which class he/she is going to enter. There will be no refund of entry fee.

13 In the event of a tie, prize money is divided.

14 No person, other than the officials and competitors, shall enter the ring unless permission is given by the Ring Master.

15 The Judge shall award a First, Second & Third in all classes and if deems worthy a Highly Commended.

16 In all classes, where a donation is given, the ordinary prize money is cancelled, unless otherwise specified.

17 Points in competition will be First 5, Second 3, Third 1. In Sheep Section where only one exhibitor, points will be halved.

18 In any event run on a sweepstake basis, fees shall be divided at First 50%, Second 20%, Third 10% as prize money.

19 The decision of the Committee is final in all matters pertaining to the Show not provided in these regulations.

20 All protests must be made in writing accompanied by \$50 and must be in the hands of the Secretary 1/2 hour after conclusion of the class on Show Day. If protest is upheld, money will be refunded.

21 All Non Members admitted to grounds will be charged admission fee whether in charge of exhibit or not.

22 Members whose subscription is one year or more in arrears will be debarred from all privileges.

23 Subscriptions payable annually: Member \$20 which entitles member to 2 Adult passes and reduced fees for family (Children under 17 years at date of Show). Gate admission passes will be issued to financial members only.

24 No one will be permitted to put any placard or advertisement in the buildings or on the grounds without the permission of the Association.

25 No unauthorised person shall be permitted to enter produce during judging. 26 Trade Exhibits: Space allocated on application.

27 **SHEDS CLOSE AT 4P.M**. EXHIBITS MAY NOT BE COLLECTED FROM THE STEWARDS BEFORE 4P.M. UNLESS ARRANGEMENT IS MADE WITH THE HEAD STEWARD WHEN PLACING EXHIBIT. PHOTOS MAY BE COLLECTED AT 4.15P.M.

28 The Association will not be responsible for exhibits left on grounds or in sheds after 4.30p.m. on Show Day.

29 All trophies will be collected from the Secretary after engraving and all trophies must be returned to the Secretary prior to the Show. Trophies unless won outright must not be taken out of New Zealand.

30 The Committee has the right to cancel any entry if in their opinion the competitor is unfit to participate.

31 **CLEAN SPORT**: The Rules of the Royal A&P Society New Zealand in regard to Clean Sport apply. Competitors are advised that tests for forbidden substances may be carried out during the Show/Event and that testing of all animals is at the person responsible's risk. Forbidden Substance - Any substance capable of affecting the speed, stamina, courage or conduct of a horse, pony, donkey or mule by its action upon the central or peripheral nervous system or the cardiovascular, respiratory, alimentary, digestive, muscoskeletal or urogenital systems.

32 The Committee reserves the right to alter, combine or delete classes as it deems fit. 33 If a late entry is required in the Equestrian Sections entry fee plus 50% is required to be paid.

34 On presentation of a Vet Certificate for a refund of entry fees in the Equestrian Section 75% of fee will be refunded.

35 **YELLOW CARD**: This Show supports the RAS 'Yellow Card' system. A Yellow Card will be issued, in cases of offences in respect of abuse of animals or inappropriate behaviour as per the RAS Constitution and the RAS Rules & Regulations/Bylaws including the Equestrian Rulebook, the RAS affiliated Show/Event/registered Measuring Stand and their grounds and their duly appointed delegates may deliver to the Person Responsible a Yellow Warning Card (either immediately or within 10 days of the show) which suspends any penalty until possible new offences. Full wording of the 'Yellow Card' system is available to view on the RAS website - <u>www.ras.org.nz</u>

36 Arrears - No person who is in arrears with regard to entry fees, subscriptions, or any other Show/Event charge is eligible to compete at any affiliated Show/Event. Proof of payment will be required before any restriction if lifted.

37 Summary of RAS Resolution Process - The full process can be found on the RAS website <u>www.ras.org.nz</u>. The principle behind the process is to deal with the matter as it comes to hand and in most cases it should be dealt with directly by the show. If the matter is in regards to an RAS official, the show will forward the matter on to the RAS CEO to deal with this in an appropriate manner.

38. In the event of unforeseen catastrophic circumstances 25% of entry fees will be held by the Association to cover costs incurred. Annual Membership fee is not refundable.
