

SHOW RULES

- 1. No trimming of whiskers, eye or inner ear hair/whiskers of horses/ponies competing at RAS affiliated A&P Shows/Events. as from 1 January 2022
 - See link https://www.ras.org.nz/equestrian/whisker-and-inner-ear-trimming/
- 2. This show is affiliated with the Royal Agricultural Society of New Zealand and now runs under the RAS rules of showing.
- 3. RAS In-Line Resolution Process Protests / Behaviour & Conduct / Complaint
 - a. In-Line RAS Resolution Process will be followed for all inappropriate behaviour by exhibitor, competitor, member, official, spectator; exhibitor competitor rule breakage, animal abuse etc.
 - b. The sanctions of YELLOW CARD for warning and RED CARD for penalty/expulsion will be used.
 - c. Every objection or protest must be made in writing, signed by the person making such complaint, and delivered to the Show Secretary.
 - d. The RAS 'In-Line Resolution Process' policy is available to view on the RAS website www.ras.org.nz
- 4. *Clean Sport* The Rules of the Royal A&P Society New Zealand in regard to Clean Sport apply. Competitors are advised that tests for forbidden substances may be carried out during the Show/Event and that testing of all animals is at the person responsible risk. Forbidden Substance Any substance capable of affecting the speed, stamina, courage or conduct of a horse, pony, donkey or mule by its action upon the central or peripheral nervous system or the cardiovascular, respiratory, alimentary, digestive, musoskeletal or urogenital systems,
- 5. *Arrears* No person who is in arrears with regard to entry fees, subscriptions, or any other show/event charge is eligible to compete at any affiliated show/event. Proof of payment will be required before any restriction is lifted.
- 6. **Summary of RAS Resolution Process** the full process can be found on the RAS website www.ras.org.nz. The principle behind the process is to deal with the matter as it comes to hand and in most cases, it should be dealt with directly by the show. If the matter is in regard to an RAS official the show may request the assistance or RAS Head Office as to how to deal with this in an appropriate manner.
- 7. RAS Equestrian Levy is incorporated into the class entry fee.
- 8. The Organizing Committee accepts no liability for any accident, damage, injury or illness to Horses, Owners, Handlers, Grooms or Spectators, or to any other personal property whatsoever.
- 9. Exhibitors must comply with the appropriate animal legislation and Health and Safety Employment Act 2015
- 10. All animals to be registered with their respective Breed societies where sections require this. REGISTRATION NUMBERS ARE TO BE WRITTEN ON ENTRY FORM.
- 11. Registration Certificates and Height Certificates may be asked for where applicable.
- 12. Starting times will be adhered to as closely as possible. ONE CALL ONLY.
- 13. Stallions & Colts
- a. All stallions and colts (with the exception of Miniature horse and foals) must be shown in a bit.
- **b.** A steward will order any stallion/colt considered out of control or to be causing undue disquiet to other horses/ponies from the ring without recourse from the Stallion/colt's owner/exhibitor/competitor.
- c. It is **compulsory for all stallions and colts**, except foals, to wear **two (2) official 'S' identification** badges, one attached to each side of their bridle, at all Shows/Events at all times. The rider/leader must also wear two (2) RAS official armbands (one on each arm) when in the ring, 'S' badges to be purchased from RAS Head Office or ESN; armband from RAS Head Office.
- **d.** Handlers of stallions/Colts must wear an approved HI VIZ vest at Shows/Events when outside the showing ring. Vests can be purchased from RAS Head Office
- e. Pony Stallions must be led by handlers 14yrs and over.
- f. Stallions over 148cm must be led by a handler 17yrs and over.

- 14. Follow Covid 19 rules
- 15. Show will retain 10% if show cancelled due to extreme weather event or Covid.

16. Mares

- **a.** 'Dry' mare is a mare not to foal during the current show season (1 August to 31 July).
- **b.** Mares shown in Brood Mare classes must have a foal at foot or present a veterinary certificate of pregnancy that includes a projected foaling date. Mares shown in the summer season without a foal at foot, would be expected (before Christmas) to be late foaling in the summer of autumn, or (after Christmas) to have weaned an early foal and be back in foal with a spring due date. Mare falling into either of the above categories should prove their eligibility with a veterinary certificate. Anything less will be unacceptable.
- 17. Foals under 3 weeks of age must not be exhibited. They must be led by separate handler.
- 18. Any horses found in unpaid for stables/yards will be removed.
- 19. Applicants for refunds must be made in writing accompanied by a Doctors/Veterinary certificate and received within 7 days from the date of show. Refunds will be made after the show at the committee's discretion with a maximum refund of 75% of fees paid.
- 20. Unruly, lame or unwell animals will be required to leave the ring.
- 21. NO DOGS ALLOWED ON THE GROUNDS. This is a venue requirement and will strictly be enforced.
- 22. Stables/Covered Yards/Pens must be left clean.
- 23. Competitors to clean up all manure from around Floats/ Trucks and place it in the bins provided.
- 24. No temporary tape or rope fences to be erected on the show grounds.
- 25. All protests must be in writing and submitted to the Protest Committee within thirty (30) minutes of the incident, together with a \$50 protest fee, this will be refunded if the protest is upheld. The decision of the Protest Committee will be final.
- 26. Entry fees are per horse per class
- 27. Three (3) or more entries at closing date to enable a breed ring to take place.
- 28. Organizing Committee and stewards retain the right to change the order of, alter or delete classes and merge sections.
- 29. Donated product may be in place of prize money.
- 30. Exhibitors, grooms, and helpers must wear closed in footwear.
- **31. JUNIOR/SENIOR HANDLER CHAMPIONSHIP CLASSES** Must use same horse/pony you qualified with in the breed section for championship class; however, dispensation may be given at the discretion of Chief Steward.



- A Leisure Horse/Pony is a mount with excellent manners, strong even free paces and with sufficiently good conformation as to ensure a comfortable and pleasurable ride over a long distance or in whatever activity chosen by the handler/ rider.
- Can not enter other sections at this show
- This section is for exhibitors who want to have a go at inhand showing
- Classes 2 to 4 you will be asked to walk around the ring clockwise with handler on the outside of
 the pony/horse. Then line up beside one other giving room for the judge to walk around you to look
 at your pony/ horse standing. The judge will ask you to then work on a upside down triangle
 (Clockwise with you on the outside so judge can see your pony/horse). Walk out, turn right, trot
 across, turn right again and trot back to judge and halt. (This is for the judge to see how your pony/
 horse moves and the manners etc.)
- Combination (the same handler and horse/pony) not to have competed in the open show ring.
 For example, show pony, hack etc ??
