COMPLETION OF ENTRY FORMS

- Refer to section for fees. All entries are inclusive of GST.
- All entry forms must be signed and entry fees calculated correctly for entry fees to be accepted.
- Gate passes: One gate pass will be issued after payment of \$10 or more in entry fees.
- Entry forms that have not been signed, or in which entry fees have been calculated incorrectly, will be returned. This applies to all entrants, including Members who have not paid their annual subscription, but who have calculated their entry fees on the Member's fees.

GENERAL CONDITIONS & REGULATIONS

- All entries close with the Secretary, in writing, or online before 20 SEPTEMBER 2024, unless otherwise stated, and must be the property of the exhibitor at the time of making the entry. No exhibit will be catalogued unless entry fees are paid in full.
- 2. RIGHTS OF COMMITTEE: The committee reserves the right to refuse or cancel any entry without giving any reason for doing so and reserves the right to make any alteration to the show timetable or withdraw any event as may be deemed desirable. If there are insufficient entries in a class at close of entries, classes may be combined. Any unruly or dangerous animal or exhibit may be required to leave the showgrounds.
- 3. **CANCELLATION/REFUND:** Due to any unforeseen circumstance our show being cancelled memberships will not be refunded. The Committee will look into refunding entries excluding the administration fee but doesn't guarantee a refund will be given. In the case of an exhibitor unable to attend the show a refund may be issued less administration fee and 20% of their entry fee.
 - For Horse exhibitors please refer to the front of the Horse Section. Trade refunds will be issued less 20% due to cancellation of show and if received 14 days prior to the show after this there will be no refunds issued.
- The Ellesmere Agricultural & Pastoral Association will account for the Goods and Services Tax on an inclusive basis.
- The same animal cannot be entered in two classes; but this shall not apply to Private or Special Prizes, and to the several classes in Cattle, Horses.

- EXTRA STOCK: Stock, Implements, etc. not eligible under any of the enumerated classes, may be exhibited by paying one-half of the usual entrance fees. N.B. – No prize will be awarded where the Judges consider there is a class in which such stock can be exhibited.
- Exhibitors will be required to state as accurately as possible, at the time of entry, the date of birth of all stock in classes where age is to be specified; also the date of the last shearing of Sheep.
 - **N.B.** Cattle of two years must not show more than four broad teeth and of three years, six but not eight.
- 8. A maiden is defined as an animal that has not won a First Prize at an A. & P. Show at closing date.
- All Bulls must be led and tied by a ring through the nose.
 One man must be in attendance with each lot of cattle.
- 10. Any Cow or Ewe which is barren shall not be eligible to take a prize, except in the Fat Stock classes. If any Mare shall lose her foal, or if it should have met with an accident such mare will be eligible to compete if she is in milk.
- 11. **Time of Judging** Exhibits must be ready for judging at the times specified in the schedule.
- 12. No competitor or exhibitor or members of their family shall approach a Judge with regard to a decision unless they first obtain the permission of the Show Convenor/Manager/Ring Master or Ring Steward the most senior of whom shall carry the decision on the day.
- 13. **REMOVAL OF EXHIBITS** No Exhibit or Implements exhibited to be removed from the Showgrounds until 4.00pm on the Saturday, without special permission from the Secretary. The doors of the Produce Sheds will be closed at 5.00pm.
- 14. The Committee will not, under any circumstances, hold themselves responsible for loss, damage or mis delivery of Stock, Poultry, Produce, Implements, or any other exhibit or thing exhibited at the Show.
- 15. PRIZE MONEY All prize money will be paid in cash on the day of the show except for the sheep section, which will be direct credited to the winners' bank account, where possible, after the Show. School Lambs Prize money will be paid on the day. Produce Section Prize money will be paid on the day, at 4.00pm by the Steward in charge of the Section. At the time of printing this schedule, the Association advertises all sponsorship and special prizes in good faith but will not be liable for the payment of any sponsorship or special prizes not received from the sponsor, as they are not all confirmed by the time the schedule goes to print.
- 16. In all classes where two or three prizes have been awarded, the judges are directed to "very highly commend", "highly commend" or "commend" the other exhibits worthy of these distinctions.

- 17. Third prize money will not be awarded in any class in which there are less than five entries; in the event of there being no competition in any class, no prizes will be given unless the Judges certify to particular merit. Power is reserved to withhold a prize where the Judges consider it ought not to be awarded, for want of sufficient merit, even where there is competition.
- 18. Judges of Stock, in arriving at their decisions, are requested not to give undue weight to high condition (except in classes for Fat Stock), but to award the prizes to the animals in each class which they consider best represent the particular breed of the description intended to be encouraged. Judges are directed to pass over all animals whose want of condition be token weakness of constitution, however great their merit may be in other respects.
- Discrepancies in the prize list must be notified in writing to the Secretary within fourteen days from the date of the Show, or they will not on any account be entertained.
- All prizes not claimed within six months after the date of the Show, will be forfeited.
- 21. PROTESTS All protests must be left with the Secretary either before or after the Judges have proceeded to their duties. The party entering a protest must deposit \$50.00, which will be returned if the protest is sustained. If the protest is lodged before the Judges proceed to their duties, the onus of proof will rest with the exhibitor; if after that, the onus of proof will rest with the party protesting. The Committee will meet at the Secretary's Office at 3.30 p.m. on the Saturday to consider all protests: five members to form a quorum. All protests must be lodged within one hour after the exhibits are judged, or the awards distributed.
- 22. GENERAL Any Exhibitor infringing any of the above Regulations shall be subject to be dealt with as may be decided by the Committee, whose decision shall be final. The decision and ruling of the Committee on any rule, regulation, protest or any other matter affecting the Association will be final and absolute, without the right of appeal.

The RAS charge a levy of \$1.25 per entry, per class which has been incorporated into the entry fees and will be passed on to them.

PRIZE MONEY: First – \$20.00, Second – \$15.00, Third – \$10.00 – unless stated otherwise. Classes with less than 5 entries will receive reduced prize money.

ADMINISTRATION FEE: An additional administration fee of \$10.00 per rider/handler is payable with entry fees.

JUDGING TIMES: Prior to Show Day please check website/Facebook for any changes to class times.

For Presentation and Parade details and times please check catalogue.

The Horse section is run under the Royal Agricultural Society Equestrian, Competitors and Judges Rules. Please familiarise yourself with the General Regulations listed in the front of the schedule.

BOXES & YARDS: Covered stables are available and will be allocated at the discretion of the convenor. Costs are \$10 for stallion boxes, \$7 for covered boxes and \$5 for open yards per night. You MUST state on the entry form which nights/days are required. Fees to be paid with entry. Tape yards are not to be erected on grounds.

RESOLUTION PROCESS: This Show supports the RAS In-Line Resolution Process Policy. A Yellow or Red card will be issued for offences of abuse of animals or inappropriate behaviour as per the RAS Constitution and the RAS Rules & Regulations/Bylaws including the Equestrian Rulebook. Full wording of the In-Line Resolution Process Policy is available to view on the RAS website — www.ras.org.nz.

PROTESTS: See General Conditions at the front of the Catalogue.

PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR: All riders, including harness drivers, competing at RAS affiliated A&P Shows / Events must wear approved protective headgear. These must be tagged with a YELLOW approval sticker prior to the day of competition. The current standards can be found at www.ras.org.nz – equestrian. Standard protective headgear tags are changing from 1st August 2023.

CLEAN SPORT: Competitors are advised that tests for forbidden substances may be carried out during the Show under RAS rules. A Forbidden Substance is: any substance capable of affecting the speed, stamina, courage or conduct of a horse, pony, donkey or mule by its action upon the central or peripheral nervous system or the cardiovascular, respiratory, alimentary, digestive, muscoskeletal or urogenital systems.

RIGHTS OF COMMITTEE: The committee reserves the right to refuse or cancel any entry without giving any reason for doing so and reserves the right to make any alteration to the show timetable or withdraw any event as may be deemed desirable. If there are insufficient entries in a class at close of entries, classes may be combined. Any unruly or dangerous animal or exhibit may be required to leave the showgrounds. Handlers must be capable of managing their exhibits.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY:

- All Novice Horses and Ponies to be ridden in a snaffle bridle while on the grounds (except Hunter Jumping Classes and Working Hunter).
- Online entries will not be downloaded or confirmed until payment has been received.
- ARREARS No person who is in arrears with regard to entry fees, subscriptions, or any other show/event charge is eligible to compete at any affiliated show/event. Proof of payment will be required before any restriction is lifted.
- All Stallions and colts (with the exception of Miniature Horses and Foals) must be shown in a bit. All stallions and colts must be identified by two (2) official 'S' identification badges, one attached to each side of the bridle, at all Shows/Events at all times. The rider/handler must also wear two (2) RAS official armbands (one on each arm) when in the ring. 'S' badges to be purchased from RAS Head Office or ESNZ; Stallions are eligible for any ridden classes at the show with exception of show jumping. Please refer to rules CDE14 in the RAS Equestrian Rules.
- All exhibits must be entered in the name of the bona fide owner/lease/partnership.

- Where classes are defined by height, competitors/exhibitors must carry a current RAS certificate for their horse/pony and must produce upon request to any authorised show/event personal.
 The name of the exhibit must match the current RAS certificate.
- SUBSTITUTIONS A veterinary certificate must be produced to the Horse Office staff prior to the event for any horse being substituted.
- REFUNDS For any scratching on Veterinary or medical advice, a refund of 80% of the entry fee will be made. Advice of the scratching must be given prior to the judging of the class and the relevant Certificate to be given to the Event Secretary within 30 days.
- All class changes to be made to the Secretary by 12.00 pm on Thursday 17th October 2024.
- All saddlery and accessories to comply with RAS Equestrian Rules GR 5.
- A Novice is a Horse/Pony is yet to win six (6) first placings in conformation classes at any A&P Show at the time of the show.
 Wins accumulated in Hack Sections are transferable to the Saddle Hunter Section. Wins accumulated in Pony Groups A, B & C are transferred to Saddle Pony Hunter (Group D). District classes are restricted classes and wins do not count.
- A Novice Hunter is a Hunter that has not won six (6) first placings in a Hunter Jumping event over fences at any A&P Show at the time of the show.
- · Novices may enter the Open Classes.
- Novice Championships are not eligible for Open or Supreme Championships unless they have won their respective Open Class. Champion does not count as a win.
- If a novice entry has gained six wins by the day of the show the competitor must advise the Horse Office and may change the entry to an Open Class. If an Open Class is not available for entry, a refund will be given.
- Horses and Ponies must be 4 years or older be shown under saddle and driven.
- Riders of any age may ride ponies in Novice Classes. Rider's age is taken as of 1 August 2024.
- Breastplate numbers and Sports Numbers only at this Show. Back numbers are required for the Hack and Pony Hunter Jumping events. The Back Number listing will be available on the Show website in the week before the show.
- Combinations entered in the Pleasure section are NOT permitted to enter any other ridden section of the show, apart from the Pinto, and any other Breed sections. (if eligible). Horses or Ponies that compete in Open Ridden sections at any show are not permitted to enter the Pleasure sections.
- WHISKERS and INNER EAR TRIMMING Rule as from 1 January 2022 – www.ras.org.nz/equestrian/whisker-and-inner-eartrimming

MEASURING – There will be no measuring on show day. Measuring days as advertised on RAS website. Enquiries to Paula McIlraith 027 222 4473 or Tracy McIlraith Ph 027 200 0863. Where height is a requirement of the section exhibitors must carry an official RAS Life or

Annual Certificate and performance card. Failure to do so will result in elimination (CDE 1).

EXHIBITORS PLEASE NOTE: All transport conveying Horse exhibits to the show will be required to enter the Showgrounds at the North gate entrance from the Main Road and must be parked as directed by parking officials.

The judges are directed not to award prizes where hereditary unsoundness is shown to exist in classes for Brood and Stud Horses. Competitors are also advised that if they are entering more than one pony/horse that judging will not be delayed.

Current Height Certificate/Performance Card must be carried. In all Hunter events, jumping style, manners and conformation are to be taken into consideration. In ALL Hunter events (except the Novice Hunter) one baulk will disqualify. In the Novice Hunter, two baulks will disqualify.

Hunters will be required to jump a minimum of three (3) hunter type fences. Jumping style and ability 40%, conformation 30%, paces and manners 30%.

Ponies will be required to gallop within the confines and constraints of the venue. No boots or bandages permitted.
