PROTESTS AND OBJECTIONS (All animals except Dairy Cattle)

- The determination of a judge shall be final as between all competitors, unless an
 objection is made to any exhibit and allowed on the ground of disqualification.
- The duly appointed member of the Committee, along with the Chief Stewards shall
 have, at their discretion, power to decide any dispute in their respective divisions
 after consultation with the Senior Stewards of the section involved, with the
 exception of regular protests and appeals.
- All objections or protests must be made in writing within one hour of judging of the class in question, signed by the person making such complaint, and delivered to the Secretary. No protest will be received later than one hour after the completion of the judging.
- The objector shall, at the time of making such objection, lodge the sum of \$50.00 which shall be refunded should the objection or protest be sustained.
- Protests will be received without deposit from Judges only.
- If the protest is lodged prior to Judging, the onus of proof will rest with the exhibitor.
 If the judging has already commenced, the onus of proof will be with the party protesting.
- All protests will be decided as soon as practicable and the decision made shall be final.
- If a prize-winner was afterwards disqualified, the Committee may, with or without the
 advice of the judge, decide whether the next animal on the list shall gain the prize.

Late entries will be accepted with a \$20 surcharge on the exhibitor. No exceptions.

- All entries must be submitted on the Palmerston & Waihemo A & P Association's OFFICIAL ENTRY FORM or on Showdayonline.
- The Committee has the right to alter or combine classes as they see fit.
- RAS Height Certificates to be carried unless otherwise stated.
- Best Presented Points: Horse 50pts, Gear 30pts, Rider 20pts
- Ponies not exceeding 148cm are not allowed to compete in Hack events.
- Adult riders can compete in Pony Novice classes.
- Rider/Handler ages are as at 1st August 2024.
- Horses/Ponies three years and under are not to be ridden.

Refunds Policy: Only class entry fees refunded after:

- submitting a doctor's certificate within one week of the Show and/or
- submitting a veterinarian's certificate within one week of the Show and/or
- submitting a letter of explanation to the Committee within one week of the Show.

RAS GR 4. Hats And Safety Helmets

- a) In all cases current WorkSafe New Zealand rules prevail.
- b) All riders, including harness drivers, competing at RAS affiliated A&P Shows/Events must wear protective headgear, which includes a retaining harness secured to the shell at more than two points. Such headgear must be worn with the chinstrap properly adjusted and fastened when in the arena or ring, the practice area, collecting rings or anywhere else within a Showgrounds or the grounds of an affiliated Event.
- c) Hats/helmets must conform with one of the current approved safety standards, which may be subject to change but the latest list can be found at http://www.ras.org.nz – equestrian. RAS will advise any changes via their website and Facebook.

Please note that all HOY Qualifier events are subject to RAS rules as follows:

- "Competitors and Exhibitors at affiliated Shows and Events are expected to abide by the Rules and Regulations of the Royal Agricultural Society Of NZ." (ER 7)
- There is to be no trimming of whiskers, eye or inner ear hair/whiskers of horses/ponies competing at RAS affiliated A&P Shows/Events as from

1 January 2022. This is in line with the same animal welfare approach taken by Equestrian Sport New Zealand (ESNZ) and New Zealand Pony Clubs Association (NZPCA). The links below provide more detail on what is and is not permitted.

Stallions and Colts

- a) "All stallions and colts must be shown in a bit with the exception of Foals and
 Miniature Horses, and Shetland Pony Yearlings. In the case of Miniature Donkey
 Jacks 86m and under, they must either be shown in a bit or a halter and a stallion
 chain, then the donkey's original RAS height certificate must be carried at the time
 of showing, to show proof of height. A Steward will order and stallion/colt
 considered out of control or to be causing undue disquiet to other horses from the
 ring without recourse from the stallion/colt's owner/exhibitor/competitor.
- b) It is compulsory for all stallions and colts to wear two official "S" identification badges attached to each side of their bridle at all shows/events at all times. The rider must also wear two RAS official armbands (one on each arm) when in the ring.
- c) Handlers and riders of stallions and colts must wear an approved hi-vis vest at shows/events when outside the showing ring." (CDE 14) For further information refer to the RAS website.

Mares

- "Dry mare is a mare not in foal during the current show season (1st August 31st July)". (CDE 13a) For further information, refer to the RAS website.
- "Mares shown in brood mare classes must have a foal at foot or present a veterinary certificate of pregnancy that includes a projected foaling date." (CDE 13b) For further information refer to the RAS website.

Forbidden Substances —any substance capable of affecting the speed, stamina, courage, or conduct of a horse, pony, donkey, or mule by its action upon

the central or peripheral nervous system or the cardiovascular, respiratory, alimentary, digestive, muscoskeletal, or urogenital system. Please note:

- The RAS Equestrian Levy of \$1.25 is incorporated with the entry fees as set.
- An exhibit may only be entered in the Show Hack or Riding Horse or Saddle Hunter section as per RAS ruling.

OBJECTS of the ASSOCIATION

Among the benefits expected to be derived from this Association are the following:

- a. Encouragement to improve in husbandry and stockbreeding;
- b. The drawing together periodically of the community to foster friendship.

RULES of the ASSOCIATION

In carrying out these objects, the Association will be guided by the following rules:

- That the Association be called "Palmerston & Waihemo Agricultural and Pastoral Association Incorporated".
- The Association shall be registered under the Incorporated Societies Act 1908, and the Office of the Secretary for the time being, shall be the registered office.
- The Common Seal of the Association shall be kept in the custody of the Secretary, and shall be fixed to any documents or writing, only by resolution of the Committee, by two members of such Committee together with the Secretary.
- 4. That the financial year of the Association shall end on 31st March in each year.
- 5. That the Annual General Meeting of members (8 to form a quorum) of the Association shall take place within six (6) weeks of the end of the financial year. The date of the meeting with the object thereof, to be made known by advertisement at least 14 days before the day of the meeting.
- 6. The Association shall be managed by a President, Vice President(s), Immediate Past President, Secretary and Treasurer and a General committee of no fewer than four (4), eight (8) altogether (exclusive of Life members), five (5) to form a quorum.
- 7. That the President, Vice President(s), Secretary and Treasurer be ex officio members of the Committee.
- 8. That the President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer be elected at the Annual General Meeting.
- 9. That the Members of Committee be elected at the Annual General Meeting.
- 10. That the Committee may fill any vacancy occurring in their body during the year.
- 11. That the Committee shall appoint all Officers, define their duties, nominate appropriate judges, and transact any other business necessary to carry out the objects of the Association.
- 12. That the Association will adhere to the rules of Charities Services as set out in their documents with regard to Tier 4 accounting practices and reporting.
- 13. The Treasurer shall receive all monies, and deposit same in a bank or banks recommended and approved by the Committee. The Treasurer shall pay out monies in payment of Association's obligations only on authority of the Committee. He or she will have custody and keep and maintain records of the Association's receipts and disbursements, and shall annually make out a detailed account of the income and expenditure of the Association's funds. The Committee to have these accounts audited, a statement of the funds made up, and a report prepared of the proceedings of the Association during the past year.

- 14. The Committee be empowered at any of the ordinary meetings to call a General Meeting of the Association, and the Secretary, on the requisition of six members of the Committee, to call a meeting of the Committee.
- 15. That before any General Meeting of the Association be held, a public notice of at least 14 days be given to the Members by advertisement.
- 16. Persons will become members of the Association on payment of the annual subscription as set by the Committee at an Annual General Meeting.
- 17. Any person contributing the sum of \$800 (this sum to be reviewable at each AGM) shall be eligible for a Life Membership. Where a Life Membership is awarded for exemplary and/or long service (10 years minimum), the Management Committee will propose it be awarded at the AGM in the following year.
- 18. That an admission ticket shall be given to each member of the Association on payment of his or her subscription for the year, and that this ticket, bearing the member's name, shall, on presentation, shall on presentation admit him or her free to the annual A&P show.
- 19. No member in arrears of his or her annual subscription shall be allowed to compete for prizes or to vote or to act at meetings of the Association.
- 20. All competitors shall pay the entrance fees determined on by the Committee.
- 21. Any competitor convicted of wilful misrepresentation at entering shall forfeit prize money that may have been awarded to him or her, and he or she shall not be allowed to compete at any future competition nor be a member of the Association during the pleasure of the Association.
- 22. Committee Members wishing to withdraw from the Association, shall give notice of their intention in writing to the Secretary prior to the Annual General Meeting, otherwise they shall be held to continue their membership for the year.
- 23. Termination of membership:
 - Membership shall be terminated in the following way:
 - If, for any reason whatsoever, the Committee is of the view that a Member is breaching the Rules or acting in a manner inconsistent with the purposes of the Society, the Committee may give written notice of this to the Member ("the Committee's Notice"). The Committee's Notice must:
 - Explain how the Member is breaching the Rules or acting in a manner inconsistent with the purposes of the Society;
 - ii. State what the Member must do in order to remedy the situation; or state that the Member must write to the Committee giving reasons why the Committee should not terminate the Member's Membership.
 - iii. State that if, within 14 days of the Member receiving the Committee's Notice, the Committee is not satisfied, the Committee may in its absolute discretion immediately terminate the Member's Membership.
 - iv. State that if the Committee terminates the Member's Membership, the Member may appeal to the Society.
 - 24. That the Committee, by resolution at the Annual General Meeting, shall have the power to act in the event that the Association requires to borrow money.

- 25. That meetings as required of the Association, shall be held regularly throughout the year for the transaction of general business.
- 26. That any alteration in, or addition to, the foregoing rules must be made at a General Meeting of the Association, at which not fewer than 15 members shall be present, or via email and proxy voting on the appropriate form.
- 27. That the Association may be wound up voluntarily in the manner provided by section 24 of "The Incorporated Societies Act, 1908," and any resolution passed for the voluntary winding up of the Association shall also provide for the disposition of the surplus funds and property of the Association after the discharge of all liabilities provided that the surplus funds and property shall be disposed of for charitable purposes.
- 28. That the Treasurer to produce said accounts and statements of funds to the General Meeting, and submit abstract thereof in accordance with subsection 12 of the "The Agricultural and Pastoral Societies Act, 1877".
- 29. Any income, benefit or advantage must be used to advance the charitable purposes of the organisation.
- 30. No member of the organisation, or anyone associated with a member, is allowed to take part in, or influence any decision made by the organisation in respect of payments to, or on behalf of, the member or associated person of any income, benefit or advantage.
- 31. Any payments made to a member of the organisation, or person associated with a member, must be for goods or services that advance the charitable purpose and must be reasonable and relative to payments that would be made between unrelated parties.

REGULATIONS

- All stock to be bona fife property of the exhibitor. An exhibitor infringing this
 regulation, being a prize-taker, shall forfeit all his prizes won at the show, and
 be liable to disqualification.
- Sheep exhibits must be on the ground and yarded at 9.30am. Judging to commence sharp at 10am.
- 3. Members and Non-members entry fees to be shown in each section for exhibits.
- 4. The judges are empowered to withhold the prizes in any department in which there is not sufficient merit.
- All led horses exhibited to be led by the hand and under the charge of a competent person.

- 6. The stewards in the various classes are joined and empowered to prevent any person interfering with the judges during adjudication and no exhibitor or other person (other than Judges, Stewards and Secretary) will be permitted to go inside the ring while the exhibits are being judged, except in such cases as the Stewards may deem necessary; and no owner of stock to be allowed in the ring while stock is being judged, unless said owner is actually in charge of the stock. This rule to be strictly enforced.
- 7. All protests, objections and every matter in dispute of whatever nature, by or between any persons whatsoever, shall be determined by the General Committee, of whom five (5) shall form a quorum, and whose decision shall be absolutely final, and binding on all parties, whether such dispute be between person or persons and the Society or not.
- 8. Any persons who, in the opinion of the General Committee or Stewards, shall have been guilty of any insulting or improper conduct or disobedience towards any of the Stewards, members of Committee or any other official, may be warned off the grounds, or any other place under the control of the Society, and in the event of such person not complying immediately with such warning, he or she may be forthwith ejected therefrom, or may be dealt with as the Stewards or General Committee may direct. The RAS "Yellow Card" system will apply.
- 9. When not performing in the ring, horses to be walked or driven at a walking pace through the grounds, except in the designated exercise area.
- The Association accepts no responsibility for accidents to exhibitors in charge of stock on the Show Grounds.
- 11. Marshals shall have charge of the respective sections allotted to them and shall generally supervise the work of the attending Members.
- 12. Stewards will attend to the reception, classification and placing of all exhibits, and to all matters in connection there with. They will wait upon the Judges, finish them with prize cards, and ribbons, and afford all information and attention necessary to the discharge of their duties, and see that there is no interference on the part of the public or exhibitors with the Judges in the execution of their work. They will also see that the prize cards or ribbons are properly affixed to the exhibits, and study the comfort and convenience of both exhibitors and the public, and for instructions shall refer to the Marshal in charge of their sections.
- 13. The supervisor shall arrange that the Show and judging of all sections shall start at the pre-arranged time, and generally assist the Marshals in the performance of their duties.
- 14. All applications for open selling rights and exhibits of a like nature must give full description of exhibit at time of application.
- 15. Any commendable Extra Stock to receive honourable mention.
- 16. No exhibits to be removed from the ground before 4pm unless with the consent of three of the Committee. If any exhibitor does so, prize money will be forfeited. This rule does not apply to horses.
- 17. SINGLE membership to the Palmerston & Waihemo A&P Assn. ten dollars (\$10.00). Children under 16 Free.
- 18. Free parking for Life Members only and vehicles displaying a Mobility sticker.

- 19. A fee of \$5.00 to be charged in ALL Livestock and Equestrian sections to cover administration costs. Children's classes are exempt from this fee.
- 20. A fee of \$5.00 to be charged in ALL Livestock and Equestrian sections to cover ground fees. Children's classes are exempt from this fee.
- 21. The Committee reserves to themselves the power to allot special prizes of not less value, for any prize money mentioned in the programme.
- 22. All protests must be lodged in writing with the Secretary, accompanied with a deposit of \$20 dollars, non-refundable, before 6pm on the day of the Show, such protest to be considered within one week by the Management Committee, that decision will be final.
- 23. Any person infringing the Regulations of the Association with regard to entries will be liable to a Penalty not exceeding fifty dollars (\$50.00) The attention of exhibitors is particularly directed to the foregoing provisions, which will be strictly enforced.
- 24. All prize money will be paid by direst credit ONLY. The exhibitor must provide the correct bank account number on the entry form.
- 25. Only one person in charge of each lot of horses will be admitted free.
- 26. Attending Marshals are requested to be at the Secretary's Office, Show Grounds, not later than 7.45am on the day of Show.
- 27. Late entries will be considered at the discretion of the Secretary with a \$20 surcharge on the exhibitor.
- 28. Equestrian entry fees will only be refunded on receipt of a medical certificate for the rider and/or a vet certificate for the mount, or at the discretion of the committee. Such certificates must be submitted within seven working days of the Show or other event.
- 29. A fine will be issued for any gear, including back numbers, that are not returned within 10 working days.


