GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

- All Exhibits to be bona fide property of the Exhibitor at the time of entry. The age of animals exhibited must be stated when entering them for the show.
- All bulls for exhibition to be led by a ring or halter. All Cattle, except Prime Stock, to be shown in the ring.
- No diseased animal, or animals, from a flock or herd known to be infested with disease, will be allowed to be shown. On this point, a declaration may be required by the Secretary from the Exhibitor.
- 4. The decision of the Judges will be final.
- Ages of animals to be reckoned from 1 June (except where specially stated.)
- Entries close with the Secretary on 31 December 2024. If late entries are accepted, they will be charged at double price.
- 7. Admission will be granted on a class ticket.
- 8. The Judges will commence their inspection at allotted time. They will decide without inquiry as to the names of the parties or places and will refer merely to quality of animals exhibited. Judges are directed not to give undue weight to high condition (except condition classes of Prime Stock) but to award the prizes to animals in each class which they consider best represent the particular breed or description intended to be encouraged. The Judges are directed to pass over all whose want of condition betokens weakness of constitution, however great their merits may be in other respects. Any Cow or Ewe which, in the opinion of the Judge, is barren shall be eligible to take a prize only in the Prime Stock classes.
- Where there is no competition in any class, no prizes are to be awarded unless the Judge certifies to special merit.
- 10. Stock for Exhibition to be in the yards before 8:00am on the morning of the show. No removal of Exhibits will be allowed before 4:00pm without the sanction of the Committee.
- 11. The prize money MUST be claimed within 10 days after the Show, or else it will be forfeited and become the property of the Society.
- 12. Class sponsorship monies and product are subject to confirmation and will be paid in lieu of Association prize money. The Association takes no responsibility for sponsorships which do not eventuate.
- 13. Exhibitors to give any information relative to their Exhibits that the Secretary may require. In all disputes the decision of the Committee must be final. Protest may be lodged with the Secretary within half an hour of the awards on the day of the Show, to be accompanied by a deposit of \$20, to be forfeited to the Society should the protest be considered frivolous or vexation.
- 14. All cattle to be paraded in the Grand Parade which will be led by the Aakland Group Challenge Trophy winner then in catalogue order.

15. Admission to Show Ground: Adults: \$15.00 Under 15 years, \$2.00

Car Parking: Free

16. The Committee reserves the right to allot Specials in lieu of Prize Money mentioned in the Schedule. The Committee expect a few Special Prizes which they will allot as they may think advisable.

The Association has received several Trophies which accordingly will be allotted in the Catalogue.

- 17. No Steward shall act in any class in which they are an Exhibitor.
- 18. Where classes are sponsored with naming rights and Sponsorship total more than the normal A&P Prize money, then only the Sponsorship money will be paid out.
- 19. No animal or its attendant shall have any initial, crest or mark of ownership on its rug, harness, pail or any other fitting. This rule shall not apply to Trades classes. Prize Cards which have been awarded by the Judges must only be displayed after final judging, in such classes as the Exhibit may be entered for and then remain affixed to Exhibit during the Show, and no ribbon, prize, colours or tickets will be permitted on any Exhibit unless awarded during that section of the Show. Any infraction of the rule may incur disqualification and bar any further competition in that section of the Show. The Committee will be pleased to see Implements and Cars exhibited. Awards will be made where there may be enough competition. Due to possible restrictions on grounds space, the Committee reserves the right of admission to any or all vehicles, the Committee will make known by advertisement prior to Show Day what parking space is available in or adjacent to the Show Ground.
- 20. All refunds will be a maximum of 80% and any refund requests without a doctor's certificate or veterinary certificate will be at the discretion of the directors.
- 21. <u>Protests</u> see rule 12 Rules and Regulations All protests must be in writing and may be entered before or after the Judges have proceeded to their duties.
- 22. If the protest is lodged before the Judges proceed to their duties, the onus of proof will rest with the Exhibitor, or after the onus of proof will be with the party protesting.
- Special Rules Regarding Side Shows It is now provided that all applicants for Side Show space shall be licensed.
- 24. *Right of Committee:* The Committee, or its Supervisor, reserves the right to refuse any Side Show or Selling Stand permission to enter the Show Grounds without giving any reason therefore.
- 25. Each applicant for space for Side Show purposes shall pay down the amount of the rent before the ground is allotted. When the ballot, if any, has been taken and space allotted the space shall be occupied by the applicant and he shall not shift on to any other space or leave his space to canvas for business in any part of the ground or suffer or permit any employee or partner or other person to do so on his behalf.



- 26. No ground or space shall be allotted to any applicant except for a bonafide Side Show or Stall. "Side Show" - shall mean any space which is enclosed from the public by any marquee, tent, canvas screen or other device, and to which a charge for admission is made to the public. The Committee reserves to itself or its representatives the right to refuse space to the proprietor or manage of any Side Show when the performance therein is considered undesirable or offensive to forfeit the rent paid, and order the Side Show to be closed if the foregoing provision is not complied with. "Stall" - shall mean any open stand on which goods are displayed for sale or games played for any prize other than money. Games played for money prizes are strictly prohibited and any stall holder found offending against this regulation shall be ejected from the Show grounds.
- 27. **Rent of Spaces:** Ground fees are to be paid in full before ballot for space.
- 28. Allotment of Space for Side Shows: In such portion of the grounds set aside by the Committee of the Association for Side Shows space may be allotted by ballot or in such a manner as the Society shall arrange. No proprietor will be allowed to participate until all ground fees be paid.
- 29. **Sub Letting of Space:** No sub letting of any space will be allowed under any circumstances.
- 30. Performing Animals: All dogs and performing animals must be kept tied up or in cages within the camping area. Horses, Mules, Donkeys or Cattle will not be allowed in the ring prior to the opening of the Show. No freak or malformed living animals will be permitted on the Show Ground.
- 31. No person is permitted in any Judging Ring without the express permission from the Head Steward of that ring. Only persons directly responsible for an Exhibit are permitted in the Marshalling Area.
- 32. Each Exhibitor must supervise and control their animals at all times and shall be liable for any hazards created or accident, illness or damage caused by the action of themselves or their animals at the showgrounds. Exhibitors must comply with the appropriate Animal Legislation and the Health and Safety at Work Act 2015 and any amendments.
- 33. If insufficient entries some classes may be combined.

EQUESTRIAN SECTION

Equestrian Rules and Regulations

To be read in conjunction with the general conditions of the Winton A&P Association as set out on Page 2 of this schedule and the rules and regulations as set out by the Royal Agriculture Society.

- 1. All horses and ponies to be ridden or exercised and lunged in designated areas.
- 2. Whips to be no longer than 76cm.
- 3. No exercising inside the rings prior to competition.
- 4. Champion and Reserve Champion will be selected as follows: First Prize winners in all eligible classes to be paraded before the Judge. Immediately the Champion has been selected the Second Placed animal from the class the Champion came from shall parade with the others for Reserve Champion.
- 5 Clean Sport The Rules of the Royal A&P Society New Zealand in regard to Clean Sport apply. Competitors are advised that tests for forbidden substances may be carried out during the Show Event and that testing of all animals is at the person responsible risk. Forbidden Substance - Any substance capable of affecting the speed, stamina, courage or conduct of a Horse, Pony, Donkey or Mule by its action upon the central or peripheral nervous system or the cardiovascular, respiratory, alimentary, digestive, musculoskeletal or urogenital systems The payment of entry fee of the exhibitor on the entry form denotes acceptance of these conditions.
- 6 Arrears No person who is in arrears with regard to entry fees, subscriptions, or any other Show Event charge is eligible to compete at any affiliated Show/Event. Proof of payment will be required before any restriction is lifted
- 7 Ages: Age of Riders/Handlers are as at 1 August 2024.
 No Horse/Pony 3 years and under is to be ridden.
- 8. Entire Horses or Ponies shall not be eligible to compete in any saddle or jumping classes except for FEI Competitions. All Stallions or colts (except for Miniature Horses and foals) must be shown in a bit. it is compulsory for all stallions and colts (except foals) to wear 2 RAS official 'S' identification badges attached to each side of the bridle and the rider/handler to wear 2 RAS official armbands (one on each arm) and must wear approved Hi Viz Vest when outside the showing ring.
- A current RAS issued Annual or Life Height certificate must be carried at all times at this show

- 10. All prize winners must enter Grand Parade or forfeit any prize money.
- 11. No lunging to be done outside of warm up area.
- 12. All Champion and Reserve Champion Saddle Hacks and Ponies must be ridden in the Grand Parade, unless a special dispensation is granted by the Chief Horse Marshall to take your Hack or Pony in hand, otherwise all awards will be forfeited.
- Local Horse/Pony will be defined as: West Boundary, Otautau; East Boundary, Glencoe; North Boundary, Athol; South Boundary, Willsons Crossing
- 14. All hats/helmets must conform with one of the current approved safety standards and must be identified by the current 'Yellow' tag system implemented by NZPA, ESNZ and RAS. NOTE: As from 1 August 2023 new standards come in to force and a 'yellow' tag must be shown https://www.ras.org.nz/equestrian/health-and-safety/
- 14a Whiskers and Inner Ear Trimming as from 1 January 2022 https://www.ras.org.nz/equestrian/whisker-andinner-ear-trimming/
- 15. In-Line Resolution process Policy This Show/Event supports the RAS Policy system. A Yellow or Red Card will be issued, In cases of offences in respect of abuse of animals or inappropriate behaviour as per the RAS Constitution and the RAS Rules & Regulations/Bylaws including the Equestrian Rulebook, the RAS affiliated Show/Event/registered Measuring Stand and their grounds and their duly appointed delegates may deliver to the Person Responsible a Yellow or Red Card. Full wording of the 'Yellow Card' system is available to view on the RAS website www.ras.org.nz.
- 16. Novice Classification: A novice exhibit or rider is one that has yet to win six (6) classes in any division within the competitions provided at any A&P show/event.(excluding breed sections) Note: To clarify further at time of first day of the show/event competition, if you have won 0,1 or 2 wins you can enter the 0-2 wins class, if yon have 0,1,2 or 3 wins you can enter the 0-3 wins class, if you have 0,1,2,3,4, or 5 wins you can enter the 0-5 wins class. Once you have achieved 6 wins in conformation(and this includes Ladies or Gents classes) and/or Paced and Mannered classes, you can no longer enter in Novice classes in that category. All wins, whether they be novice or open, at all affiliated RAS shows/events including HOY show must be recorded on the RAS certificate and/ or performance card, until six wins is achieved. Novice classes do not have to be in a snaffle bit excluding standardbred novice classes. Novice ponies may be ridden by riders of any age in novice classes only but not in Open Section where the stated age applies



NZ current safety standard approved helmets only will be allowed in all Equestrian Ridden/Jumping classes and must be tagged to be legal.

Information for Equestrian Exhibitors

Allocation of Points for Trophies (Equestrian)

Points are given according to place in class (eg 1st=4 2nd=3, 3rd=2, 4th=1). Local Classes and Working Hunter Classes not eligible for points. Only one conformation and Paced & Mannered class is counted eg not both Novice and Open.

The horse with the highest aggregate of points as allocated below to receive a Grand Champion rug sponsored by PGG Wrightson, Points Allocation: Champion 2 points, Reserve Champion 1 point. Supreme Champion 1 additional point. In the event of a tie, the following count back system will apply: most Supremes. If still equal, then the Supreme at Southland A & P Show shall be declared the winner.

- All placegetters must enter the Grand Parade or forfeit any prize received.
- Please Note: All Beef and Dairy Cattle shown by any exhibitor must be registered at the time of the Show in his or her name in each particular Herd Book or be eligible for registration.
- 3. **All Beef Cattle** over one year must be led with a nose clip or ring.
- All Cattle to be paraded in the Grand Parade which will be led by the Alliance Group Challenge Trophy winner then catalogue order.
- 5. All Cattle to be NAIT tagged
- If insufficient numbers some classes maybe combined.

The following criteria will apply in both the Beef and Dairy Cattle Sections.

All pedigree cattle one year old and over must be entered in a recognised HERD BOOK. Proof of dual ownership is required.

Tuberculosis Testing - two documents required

a) The Herd declaration card; All cattle entered for showing, which are three months of age and over must be accompanied in transit by the usual signed and dated TB Declaration Card showing either TB free or C2 Herd status or better in accordance with present law. Transit cards must be produced before cattle trucks are allowed onto the showgrounds to unload stock. Failure to do so will result in stock not being allowed on the showgrounds.

TAG Exemption - exhibitors requiring exemption from tagging must apply to the nearest AgriQuality office to obtain written exemption.

b) TB Test Certificate Accreditation - TB Movement Controlled Areas: Cattle three months of age and over which are farmed or grazed within a declared TB movement area must be negative to a TB test within 60 days prior to the start date of the Show. All Other Areas: Cattle farmed or grazed outside of the declared TB movement controlled area must be negative to a TB test within 12 months prior to the start date of the Show. A clear TB test certificate showing individual animal identification numbers must accompany completed entry forms when returned to the Secretary.
