Completion of Entry Forms

- Entries must be made on the official entry forms, signed and accompanied by full payment, and be received by the Show Manager on or before the advertised closing date.
- Incomplete, incorrect or unsigned entry forms will be returned to competitors for correction. This applies to all competitors, including members of the Association that have not yet paid their annual subscription but who have calculated entry fees using the member's discount.
- Final Helensville measuring day Sunday 9th February. There will be no special measures for Helensville Show entries after this date.
- All entries must be made in the name of the bona-fide owner of the exhibits ("the competitor"), and such exhibits must have been the property of the competitor at the time of entry. Registered lessees of animals are permitted to enter under their own name.

Confirmation of Entries

- A confirmation of entries showing all details of your entries will be returned to competitor following data processing. Your entry form will NOT be returned to you.
- Responsibility It will be the competitor's responsibility, to check the details on the confirmation
 of entries carefully and ensure that all details are correct. Any alterations to classes must be
 made to the Secretary by Friday 14 February by email. NO EXCEPTIONS saving Novice
 upgrading changes see Conditions & Regulations of the Equestrian Section Classification.

Substitutions

Substitutions must be advised by email by 5pm Tuesday 18 February. Substitutions will only be accepted for the same number of entries already entered. No additional entries will be accepted.

Refund of Entry Fee

Competitors desiring a refund of entry fees must apply in writing enclosing a veterinarian's or doctor's certificate within SEVEN DAYS of the Show. Such applications will be considered by the committee, and if successful, refund will be made less 25%.

Competitor Entry Passes

Will be issued according to the following schedule - Horses -2 passes per horse to a maximum of 4. Entry for Youth, 16 and under, is FREE.

Competitor Number

Competitors must supply their own competitor number, which may be worn on the breastplate, arm or back. The competitor number is shown on the confirmation of entries which will be emailed to you at the completion of data processing.

Membership

- Annual individual membership of the Helensville A&P Assn is \$40. The membership year runs from 01 June - 31st May. 25-year Membership is \$800 (a discount of \$200).
- Children of members up to the age of 16 years are eligible to claim entry fee discount.
- New Members Discounted membership entry fees are available to current members of the Helensville A&P Assn. The Association's membership form may be completed and forwarded with entries. A membership application form is available online at www.helensvilleshow.co.nz/helensville-show-information/membership

Local

Local owner or local competitor is defined as resident within the area of the Kumeu subdivision of the Auckland Council.

Exhibiting

- Competitors will be called only twice to the ring at which time they will be automatically scratched.
- All scratchings must be advised to the Steward as soon as possible.
- Age of riders is as at 1 August 2024
- Exhibits three (3) years of age and under are not permitted in any ridden class, no matter what rules any affiliated Breed Society or Kindred Society may prescribe.
- Riders riding exhibits over 148cm must be 12 years of age or over.

Health of Animal

The Helensville A&P Association shall not be responsible for any loss or damage caused (inter alia) through disease or infection however arising. Each competitor shall have deemed to have guaranteed to the Helensville A&P Association and have given warranty that each exhibit entered and brought to the Showgrounds is free of any contagious or infectious disease.

Clean Sport

- The use of tranquillizers, stimulants, or any drugs capable of affecting the performance of horses and ponies is forbidden.
- Competitors are advised that tests for forbidden substances may be carried out during the Show and that testing of all animals is at the owner's risk. Clean Sport Testing will be carried

- out under the Royal Agricultural Society (Incorporated) Clean Sport Judicial Committee (CSJC) procedures and rules.
- Your signature on the entry form and/or participation in competition denotes acceptance of these conditions. (Ref. Rule CS of RAS Equestrian Competitors & Judges Rule Book).

In-line Resolution Process

- This Show supports the RAS "In-line Resolution Process", which will operate in the Equestrian Section of all RAS affiliated Shows and will be offered for any inappropriate behaviour towards Show officials, judges, fellow competitors or any other third party connected with the Show and bringing the equestrian discipline into disrepute, or cases which are of a less serious nature to the above in accordance with the conduct of members, owners, lessees, and/or competitors as provided in the RAS Equestrian Competitors and Judges Rule Book and rule 13 of the RAS Constitution.
- Implementation of the In-line Resolution Process will be in accordance of the RAS Rules. The full working of the process is available to view on the RAS website.

Safety Helmets

- All riders, including harness drivers, with the exclusion of heavy horse (Clydesdale) working classes, competing at RAS affiliated A&P Shows must wear protective headgear, which includes a retaining harness secured to the shell at more than two points. Such headgear must work with the chinstrap properly adjusted and fastened when in the arena or ring, the practice area, collecting rings or anywhere else within the Showgrounds or the grounds of an affiliated event.
- Hats/helmets must conform to one of the current approved safety standards. These standards
 may be subject to change, but the latest list can be found at www.ras.org.nz/equestrian. RAS
 will advise any changes via their website and Facebook. All hats/helmets that conform must
 be identified by the current tag system implemented by NZPCA, ESNZ and RAS. Please note
 as from 1st August 2023 there are new Standards, where a 'yellow' tag must be shown https://www.ras.org.nz/equestrian/health-and-safety/

Classifications

- Novice A novice horse, pony or rider is one that has yet to win six classes in any division within the competitions provided at any A&P Show. Upon achieving the sixth win in a division, a pony, horse or rider must then compete in the appropriate open classes within that division.
- Open All horses, ponies and riders that have won six classes within a designated section (as above). All may enter in open classes.

Height Certificates

• Where classes are defined by height, competitors/exhibitors must carry a current RAS Height Certificate for their horse/pony at all RAS affiliated Shows/Events and must produce it upon request to any authorised Show/Event personnel. Any competitor unable to produce such a certificate means that the exhibit is ineligible to compete and will forfeit any awards. Horses/Ponies to be presented to a showring ring with true & correct markings that match on their Height Certificate. Any competitor found to have false markings on their

horse/pony when they are presented to the gate to enter the showing ring, will be disqualified by the Show from their class/section.

- Some classes do not require a Height Certificate please read your section rules for guidance. Foals up to 6 months of age do not need Height Certificates.

Championships

In all rings, first prize winners only to parade for Champion. Once the Champion has been selected the second placed horse to the Champion MUST be allowed to parade for the judging of the Reserve Champion.

Prize Money

All prizes are subject to confirmation from sponsors. Prize money is paid out after the Show direct to your bank account, so please ensure your bank account number is filled in on the entry form.

Points Value – for Points Prizes:

Points are allocated as follows:

- First Prize 6 points
- Second Prize 4 points
- Third Prize 2 points
- Highly Commended 1 point
- Champion 2 points
- Reserve Champion 1 point

In the event of a tie, the largest number of first prizes will decide the matter, and if that fails to decide, then the value of the prize will be divided equally amongst those who have tied.

Privacy Act

The Association holds records of names and addresses of all members and competitors and may publish these for the purposes of Show, media reports, or promotional purposes at the Association's discretion. The Association may take photographs and video images of members, competitors, exhibits (including livestock) and the employees, agents and assistants of any competitor, and use this information for reporting or promotional purposes in any media at the Association's discretion.

Rights of the Helensville A&P Committee

The Helensville A&P Committee reserves the right to, at any time, for any reason, and without notice (i) refuse or cancel any entry; (ii) alter the Show timetable; (iii) withdraw or change any event or class; (iv) request the removal from the Showgrounds of animals deemed unruly or dangerous, and (v) remove any dangerous or inappropriate exhibit or display.

Protests

 All protests must be in writing and may be lodged with the Secretary within one hour of the completion of the class judged, together with a deposit of \$50 which shall be returned should the protest be sustained. Should the protest be lodged before the judges proceed to their duties, the onus of proof will rest with the competitor; thereafter, the onus of proof will be with

- the party protesting. No protest will be received later than one hour after the prize tickets/ribbons are affixed.
- The Helensville A&P Committee, or not less than three members thereof, will determine the results of all protests as soon as practicable. There shall be no appeal.

Overnight Camping

Charges for overnight camping are \$10 per horse and per human. Please book camping with the Secretary at info@helensvilleshow.co.nz

Health & Safety

- The Association will not be responsible for any accident, loss or damage that may be caused to or suffered by an exhibit, or which may be caused directly or indirectly by any other exhibit, notwithstanding any alleged negligence on the part of any officer or servant of the Association, and it shall be a condition of entry that each competitor shall hold the Association indemnified against any claim in respect of any such accident, loss or damage caused by any exhibit of such competitors. By signing the entry form declaration, competitors accept the Association's conditions of entry and indemnify the Association under the provisions of the Health and Safety at Work Act 2015 and any subsequent amendments.
- Each competitor must supervise and control their animals at all times and shall be liable for any hazards created or accidents, illness or damage caused by the action of themselves or their animals at the Showgrounds.
- Competitors must comply with the appropriate animal legislation and the Health and Safety at Work Act 2015 and any subsequent amendments.
- The Association reserves the right to order the immediate removal from the Showgrounds of any animal it considers unruly or dangerous.
- It is the Association's policy to see that all due care is taken to protect property and to protect and to keep in efficient order its own property, and to make provision for the protection of the property of others, but the Association shall not be liable to any person in case of loss or damage by reason of any defect, accident, negligence or neglect howsoever arising.
- Persons occupying grandstands, buildings, other structures or other seating accommodation
 on the Showgrounds do so at their own risk, and no claim shall be made against the
 Association in respect of any loss, or injury by reason of any defect of accident, or by reason
 of any act or omission whether negligent or otherwise, on the part of the Association or of any
 employee or agent of the Association or on the part of any other person.

Parking is entirely at the owner's own risk. Any vehicles parked will be on this condition and the Association accepts no responsibility for any loss, theft, injury or damage attributed to any negligence on the part of the Association, its employees or Stewards.




