NO LATE ENTRIES on these classes as they are judged the week before Show day.

Delivery of the actual photos, paintings and drawings by 4pm on Friday 14th February.

- All other indoor classes entry forms/fees must be at the office by **Monday 17th February 2025.**

Late entries for all other indoor classes (except for Photography, Painting and Drawing classes where there are NO LATE ENTRIES) are accepted on **Friday 21st February** from **8am - 10am** only at the Show Office of the Helensville Showgrounds.

- As late entries can cause a backlog on the day, we urge you to enter as early as possible please.

- **No family can enter more than 20 late entries on Friday 21st February.**

Completion of Entry Forms

- All entry forms must be signed, and entry fees calculated correctly for entries to be accepted.
- Entry forms that have not been signed, or where entry fees have been calculated incorrectly, will be returned immediately for correction.
- This requirement will apply to all competitors, including members of the Association that have not as yet paid their annual subscription but who have calculated entry fees using the discount available to members.

Receipt of Entries

A receipt of entries will only be provided to the entrant if they request one following data processing. As your entry form will **NOT** be returned to you, we suggest you keep a copy/photo for your records.

Responsibility

- It will be the competitor's responsibility to check the details on the receipt of entries carefully and ensure that all details are correct. Please advise any alterations to entries as soon as possible.
- The Association will take all care but no responsibility for exhibits.

Membership

- Annual individual membership of the Helensville A&P Assn is \$40. Membership year is 1 June – 31 May. There is also a 25-year membership for \$800 (a saving of \$200). Membership form is at the back of this schedule.
- Discounted membership entry fees are available to current members of the Helensville A&P Association. The Association's membership form may be completed and forwarded with entries.

Instructions to Judges and Stewards

- Judges to report to the Chief Indoor Steward on arrival.
- If the judges consider that any exhibit does not come within the regulations they are requested to report it to the Senior Steward of the class.
- In the event of there being no competition in any class, prizes may be given if the judges certify to particular merit, but they are specially requested to withhold prizes, even where there is competition, if the exhibits are of inferior description, or not suitable for the class in which they are competing.

Value of Points – for points prizes

The Points for prizes are as follows:

- First Prize - 6 points
- Second Prize - 4 points
- Third Prize - 2 points
- Highly Commended - 1 point
- Champion - 2 points
- Reserve Champion - 1 point

In the event of a tie, the largest number of first prizes will decide the matter, and if that fails to decide, then the value of the prize will be divided equally amongst those who have tied.

Winners may have their photo taken with any trophy won and receive a certificate, but cups and trophies cannot leave the Showgrounds. Trophies are updated after each Show.

- **ALL PHOTOS, PAINTINGS AND DRAWINGS FOR THESE CLASSES MUST BE DELIVERED TO THE OFFICE BY 4PM FRIDAY 14th FEBRUARY 2025 - THERE WILL BE NO LATE ENTRIES.**

Entries Close Monday 17th February 2025

- Entry form and entry fees to be emailed/paid online or delivered to the office by **Monday 17th Feb.**
- Non-perishable entries may be delivered to the Show Office, Helensville Showgrounds, 63 Railway Street, Helensville from **Wednesday 5th February between the hours of 9am - 3pm**, or by arrangement.
- Perishable goods to be delivered on **Friday 21st February, before 10am** - see below.

Friday 21st February 2025 - Indoor Judging Day

- All indoor entries to be delivered to the Helensville Showgrounds between 8am and 10am. Allow yourself plenty of time on the day, especially if you have lots of entries or late entries!
- Late indoor entries will be accepted at the Show office between 8am and 10am.
- If you have already sent through an entry form, your entries will be listed with the Steward of each section. Any other entries need to be registered as a late entry at the Show Office.
- Please enter as early as possible – late entries on the day will be limited to no more than 20 per family.
- All competitors must report to the Steward of each section to register your entries in that section.
- All entries must be registered while the competitor is still there.
- All indoor exhibits must be registered and in the exhibit hall not later than 10am.
- All persons must vacate the exhibit hall by 10:30am.
- Indoor exhibits will be judged at 11:30am.

Saturday 22nd February 2025 - Show Day

- The indoor exhibits hall will open for public viewing at 9am.
- Prize money in all classes will be awarded in full, unless otherwise stated.
- All youth prize money will be paid out on Show day from the office from 10am, otherwise in the indoor exhibit hall from 3:30pm. Adult's prize money will be paid out AFTER the Show, direct to your bank account, so please ensure your bank account number is filled in on the entry form (prize money for Adults is NOT given out in the hall on Show day, as previously).
- All persons must vacate the exhibit hall by 2.30pm on Show day, in order for the Stewards to disassemble the displays and sort the entries for collection.
- All exhibits and prizes must be collected after 3:30pm on Show day. You must report to the Steward of the section before removing any entries.
- Any entries or prize money not collected by 5:30pm on Show Day will go to the office and be held for one week. If not claimed by then, it will be banked back to the Show.
- If you have any questions about the judging, please ask the Steward of the section involved.

AG Robinson Cup For the most Indoor points of any Women's organisation member.

CWI Cup For the most Indoor points of any CWI member.

Grace Knox Memorial Trophy For the most Indoor points of any Rural Women NZ member.

Russell Cup For the most firsts in Show - all sections.

Russell Trophy For the most entries over all Indoor sections.

Privacy Act

- The Association holds records of names and addresses of all members and competitors and may publish these for the purposes of Show, media reports, or promotional purposes at the Association's discretion.
- The Association may take photographs and video images of members, competitors, exhibits (including livestock) and the employees, agents and assistants of any competitor, and use this information for reporting or promotional purposes in any media at the Association's discretion.

Rights of the Helensville A&P Committee

The Helensville A&P Committee reserves the right to, at any time, for any reason, and without notice (i) refuse or cancel any entry; (ii) alter the Show timetable; (iii) withdraw or change any event or class; (iv) request the removal from the Showgrounds of animals deemed unruly or dangerous, and (v) remove any dangerous or inappropriate exhibit or display.

Health & Safety

- The Association will not be responsible for any accident, loss or damage that may be caused to or suffered by an exhibit, or which may be caused directly or indirectly by any other exhibit, notwithstanding any alleged negligence on the part of any officer or servant of the Association, and it shall be a condition of entry that each competitor shall hold the Association indemnified against any claim in respect of any such accident, loss or damage caused by any exhibit of such competitors. By signing the entry form declaration, competitors accept the Association's conditions of entry and indemnify the Association under the provisions of the Health and Safety at Work Act 2015 and any subsequent amendments.
- It is the Association's policy to see that all due care is taken to protect property and to protect and to keep in efficient order its own property, and to make provision for the protection of the property of others, but the Association shall not be liable to any person in case of loss or damage by reason of any defect, accident, negligence or neglect howsoever arising.
- Persons occupying grandstands, buildings, other structures or other seating accommodation on the Showgrounds do so at their own risk, and no claim shall be made against the Association in respect of any loss, or injury by reason of any defect of accident, or by reason of any act or omission whether negligent or otherwise, on the part of the Association or of any employee or agent of the Association or on the part of any other person.

Parking is entirely at the owner's own risk. Any vehicles parked will be on this condition and the Association accepts no responsibility for any loss, theft, injury, or damage attributed to any negligence on the part of the Association, its employees or Stewards.

 - All exhibits must have name, address and **class number** written on the back of the mount or the print.
 - You may only enter a maximum of three prints per class.
 - No single print may be entered in more than one class.
 - Photos are not to be mounted or framed unless otherwise stated.
 - Photo trimming permitted.
 - All prints must be either 6x4" or 5x7", unless otherwise specified.
 - Photos of people must have their permission, to be entered.

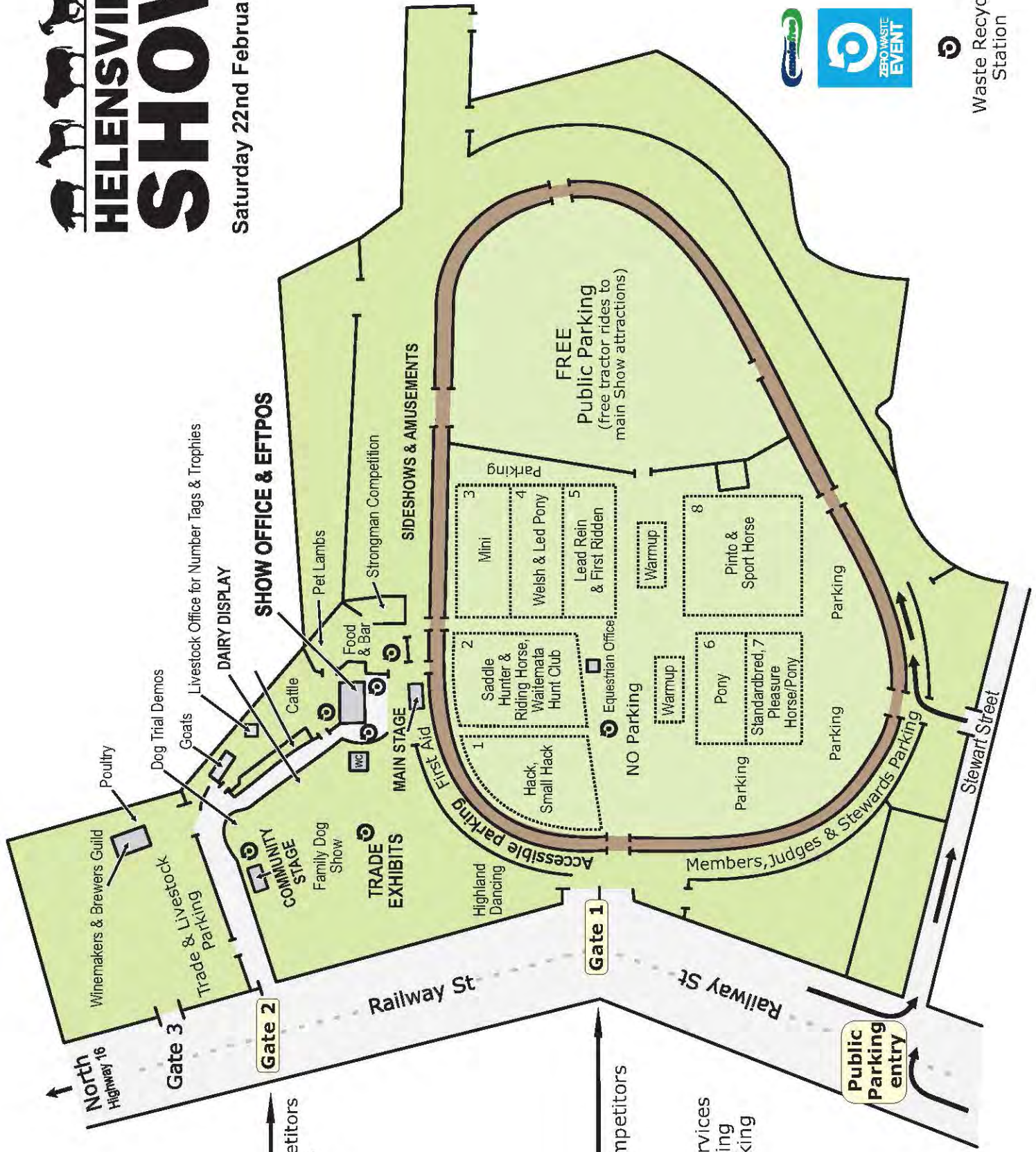
