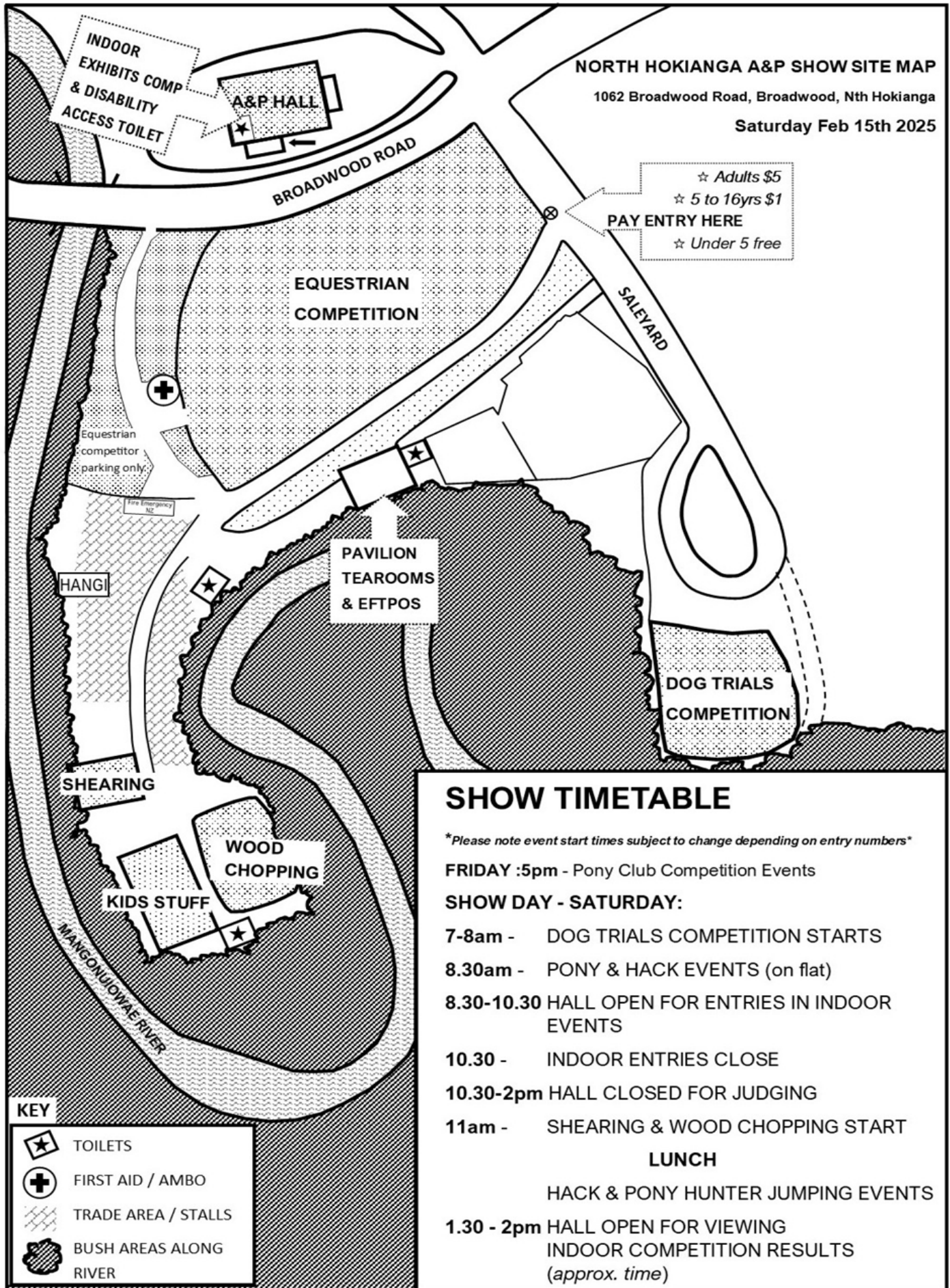

# REGULATIONS

1. The Show Committee reserves the right to make decisions regarding the running of the Show due to possible or current COVID as soon as practical possible.
2. Inside exhibits accepted up to 10.30am morning of show
3. All equestrian entries close with the Secretary 5.00pm Wednesday 12<sup>th</sup> February 2025
4. All entries must be made in the name of the bona fide owner of the exhibit
5. Entrance fees must be paid at the time of entry and no entry will be valid unless these conditions are complied with
6. Double Entry fees penalty for late entries
7. In Equestrian classes, age of riders and horses to be computed from 1<sup>st</sup> August 2024.
8. Ponies/Horses 3 years of age and under are not eligible for entry in the Riding Classes
9. All riders, including harness drivers, with the exception of heavy horse (Clydesdale) working classes, competing at RAS affiliated A&P Shows/Events must wear a helmet that has a yellow tag or they will not be permitted to compete or ride on the grounds. Such headgear must be worn with the chinstrap properly adjusted and fastened when in the arena or ring, the practice area, collecting rings or anywhere else within the Showgrounds. <https://www.ras.org.nz/equestrian/health-and-safety/>
10. No person shall have proprietorship for the time being in the pens which have been allocated to the stock entered by such persons
11. No marks, brands or designs will be permitted on any entry in the produce section.
12. No-one will be permitted to put up any placard or advertisement on the grounds without the permission of the committee
13. All bulls must be securely tied. Owners to supply ropes.
14. No stock must, on any account, be removed from the allocated place without the consent of the Stewards or Secretary, under penalty of \$20.00 for each offence
15. Pens and places will be allocated and numbered according to class
16. The committee will not under any circumstances hold themselves responsible for damage or mis-delivery of stock or exhibits of any kind exhibited at the Show
17. The committee reserves the right to substitute goods or trophies given as prizes for the money value in the Schedule
18. If only one (1) exhibit, no prize money will be awarded unless on particular merit, if only two (2) exhibits, no second prize money will be awarded unless on particular merit
19. In case the funds are insufficient (after paying working expenses and providing for liabilities) to pay prizes in full, the amount will be awarded pro rata among the prize takers
20. All protests must be writing, with a deposit of \$50.00, and left with Secretary within 1 hour of the price tickets, ribbons being affixed to the exhibits, and the committee will decide the same as soon as practicable. The deposit will be forfeited if the subject of the protest is not sustained
21. All person admitted into Show Grounds shall be subject to the rules and orders of the Committee. Undesirables may be removed from the ground by the order of the Committee
22. Exhibitors infringing any of the above regulations shall be subject to the dealt with as decided by the Committee or Sub-Committee, whose decision will be final
23. The indoor section points values shall be – First: 3, Second: 2, Third: 1
24. Members failing to bring tickets must pay at gate. Refund may be had by applying to Secretary
25. All prizes to be collected on Show Day, and if not, unless prior arrangement is made, will be forfeited
26. Indoor prizes to be collected from Hall after 3.00pm
27. Membership of Association \$5.00, Couple \$10.00
28. Admission to Show: Adult \$5.00, Children 5-16 inclusive \$1.00, Under 5 free, Vehicles \$3.00
29. Every person, including competitors and handlers will be charged an admission fee
30. Commercial trade display stands \$2.00 per square metre of total area occupied (minimum \$15.00)
31. The Association is not responsible for any omissions in the publication or alternations that may need to be made to the publication
32. The height of horses and ponies must be confirmed by production of the correct Height Certificate issued by a qualified measuring authority. Under RAS rules for Annual Certificate, 5cm only is allowed for normal shows, and no allowances for thin shoes or racing plates
33. No dogs allowed in the showground's unless competing

The following Rules & Guidelines apply to all Horses, Ponies and Riders in the Equestrian Section.

The RAS Equestrian Rules for RAS affiliated Shows/Events, Competitors, Exhibitors and Judges (see [www.ras.org.nz](http://www.ras.org.nz)) sets out all the conditions that apply to the classes and sections offered.

1. Exhibitors must comply with the appropriate animal Legislation and the Health and Safety at Work Act 2015 and any amendments thereafter
2. All riders must wear an approved safety helmet ('yellow') tagged & suitable footwear at all times. Please note as from 1 August 2023, standard change and a 'yellow' tag must be shown - <https://www.ras.org.nz/equestrian/health-and-safety/>
3. Entrants in all classes must provide a photocopy of a current Height Certificate with entry fees and must carry current certificate while competing
4. At the direction of the Royal Agricultural Society of NZ, there will be no penning behind tapes or rope of horses or ponies at any time while on the Showgrounds
5. The use of tranquillizers, stimulants or any drug capable of affecting the performance of horses or ponies is forbidden.
6. Competitors are advised that Clean Sport Testing for forbidden substances may be carried out during the Show. The testing of all animals is at the owner's risk's and will be carried out under CS procedures.
7. All horses to be brought into the ring under the direction of the ring steward.
8. All horses and ponies competing in any event must be entered in the name of the bona fide owner or a member of his or her family.
9. No refunds will be given without a Vet's or Doctor's certificate
10. Any rider or horses competing in the Horse Rings are not eligible to compete in the Pony Rings. Rider and Horses to compete in one ring only.
11. Novice Classification: all horses that have not won more than five (5) firsts in classes judged on conformation.
12. Open Classification: all horses that have won six (6) or more classes. Only Novice horses may enter in Novice Classes. All may enter in open classes.
13. A current Height Certificate must be produced before any ribbons are presented or prize money is paid out.
14. The Committee has the right to alter or combine Classes depending on numbers
15. Each exhibitor must supervise and control their animals at all times and shall be liable for any hazards created or accident, illness or damage caused by the action of themselves or their animals at the Showgrounds.
16. No person is permitted in any judging ring without the express permission of the Chief Steward of that ring.
17. Only persons directly responsible for an exhibit are permitted in the marshalling area.
18. All Horses are to be ridden with a bit attached to the bridle. Bitless bridles are not permitted for uses in North Hokianga A&P Show Ring. If used on a horse or pony, this will result in disqualification.
19. The use of Prefixes of Horses & Ponies in the Showing Classes at RAS affiliated Shows be those of the Breeder only
20. The Society reserves the right to refuse or cancel any entry without adducing any reason for doing so.
21. **No Equestrian Section entries will be accepted on Show Day**
  - a. **Except for SCHOOL PONY and DUAL JUMP**
22. Horse pens are available
23. Please clean your yards after use
24. **NO TEMPORARY PENS** (tape, rope, chain etc)
25. **Whisker and Inner Ear Trimming as from 1 January 2022** - <https://www.ras.org.nz/equestrian/whisker-and-inner-ear-trimming>.
26. Ages: Age of Riders/Handlers are as at 1 August 2024. No Horse/Pony 3 years and under is to be ridden.

# DEFINITIONS

## Hack over 158 cm

The ideal hack should be a sound quality animal with good conformation and even temperament. A top-class hack will also show elegance and gaiety and demonstrate very good movement. The stride is expected to be long, straight and light, covering a lot of ground with some extravagance. Exaggerated knee action is not desirable. The hack should possess the qualities of a good riding horse, presence, elegance and free movement. It is these qualities that catch a Judge's eye.

## Pack Hack over 148cm and up to 158cm.

The ideal Park Hack should be a sound quality animal with good conformation and even temperament. A top-class Park Hack will also show elegance and gaiety and demonstrate very good movement. The stride is expected to be long, straight and light, covering a lot of ground with some extravagance. The Park Hack should possess the qualities of a good riding horse, presence, elegance and free movement.

## Saddle Hunter over 148cm.

The ideal Hunter under Saddle should have substance, be active and well mannered, with strong easy paces. A Saddle Hunter must be capable of carrying weight for long distances over varied country. Flat Hunters are expected to gallop in their work out and gallop must play a large part in the decision of the Judge.

## Riding Horse

This is a Show Horse of slightly less elegance and gaiety than a Show Hack. Over 148cm, it has more bone and substance than a Show Hack but is not as heavy as a Hunter; with workman-like strong even paces, excellent conformation, manners and temperament, and capable of carrying a Lady or Gentleman rider pleasantly over longer journey's than a Show Hack.

## Lead Rein & First Ridden Ponies

Both leading Rein and First Ridden Ponies should be safe and suitable. They should possess a good front, even gaits and not too wide for the small riders. The stride should not be too long, as they would unseat the rider and cause the rider to lose balance. Ideally the First Ridden Pony is a little more scopey in both conformation and movement than the Leading Rein pony, although many ponies compete successfully in both sections. Combinations in one section may not enter any other section. Lead Rein riders must be 7 years of age and under. Ponies to be led by an adult with the leading rein attached to the noseband of a snaffle bridle. Ponies will be asked to walk and trot, no cantering under any circumstances. Running or bearing reins or similar tackle are not allowed. PONY The ideal pony should be a sound quality animal with good conformation and even temperaments. A top-class pony will also show elegance and gaiety and demonstrate very good movement. The stride is expected to be long, straight and light, covering a lot of ground with some extravagance and free movement. The pony should possess the qualities of a good riding horse, presence, elegance and free movement. Ponies should have definite pony type and characteristics.

## Recreation

This class is open to all riders. No height certificate is required.

## Novice

A Novice exhibit or rider is one that has yet to win six (6) classes in any division within the competitions provided by any A&P show/event.

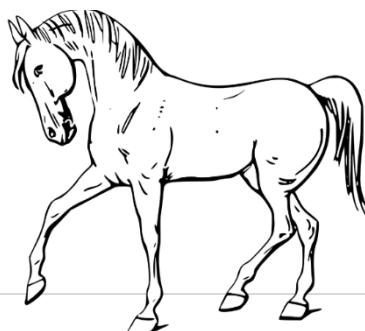

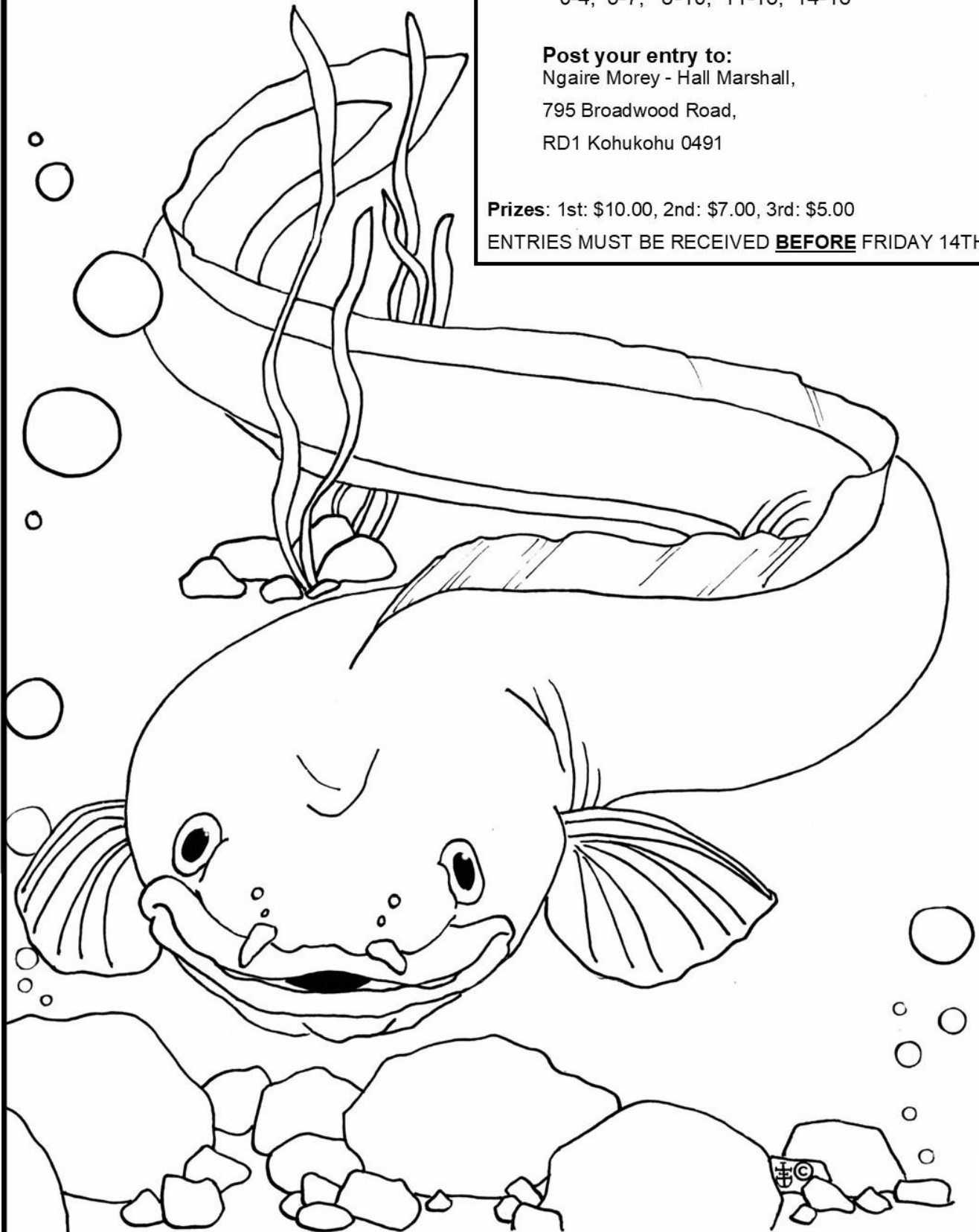

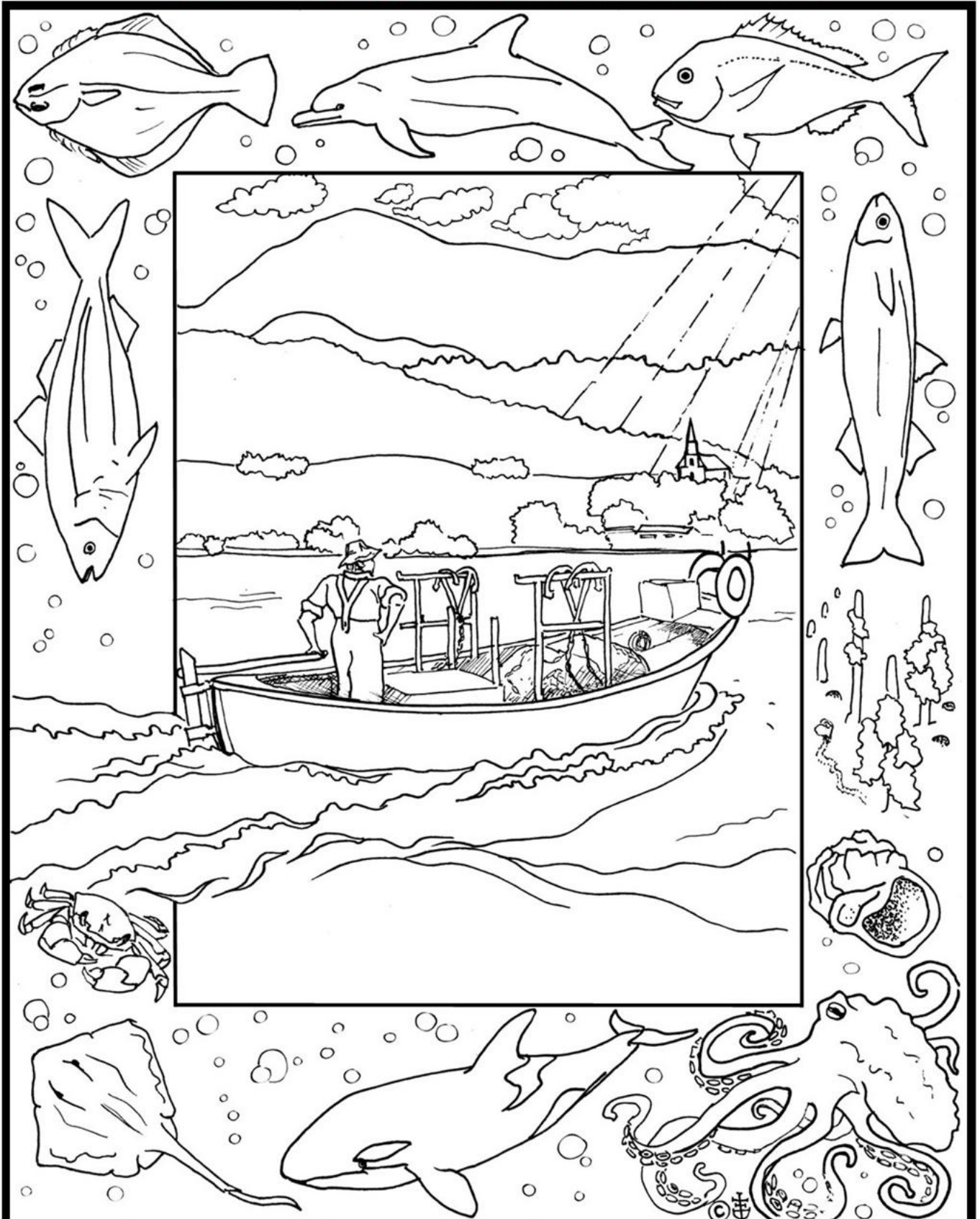
